#### Christ is born

**Luke 1:67 - 2:20**

As a little boy I woke to find Father Christmas had left the presents at the foot of my bed. Once opened I would join my brother and sisters and we would go into Mum and Dad's bedroom to give them their presents.

Year on year Dad would tease us as he delayed opening his presents squeezing, shaking, smelling, gauging the weight and trying to guess what was hidden in the wrapping paper. We were desperate for him to open it and see his response "Just open it!" Mum would say.

This week we move from secrets and coded messages to reality. No more guessing, wondering or predictions instead the invitation is to 'Go and see'. The foretelling of Advent is replaced with the forthtelling of good news for all people, 'Today' see for yourselves no more waiting.
